TUNI EXAM

- TUNI EXAM is the electronic exam service of Tampere University and Tampere University of Applied Sciences.
- In this context, an electronic exam refers to an exam conducted on a computer, which can be, for example, a final exam, a weekly assignment, or another type that aims to verify the student's knowledge and competence.

Electronic examination

- The teacher creates an electronic exam in advance in the TUNI EXAM system and sets a period during which the exam must be completed. Typically, the exam period lasts 2-4 weeks.
- Once the teacher has published the exam, the student makes an exam booking for the exam in the TUNI EXAM system.
- The student decides where and when to take the exam. Electronic exams are taken supervised examination rooms.
- After the student has completed the exam, the teacher evaluates the exam performance and provides feedback in the TUNI EXAM system.

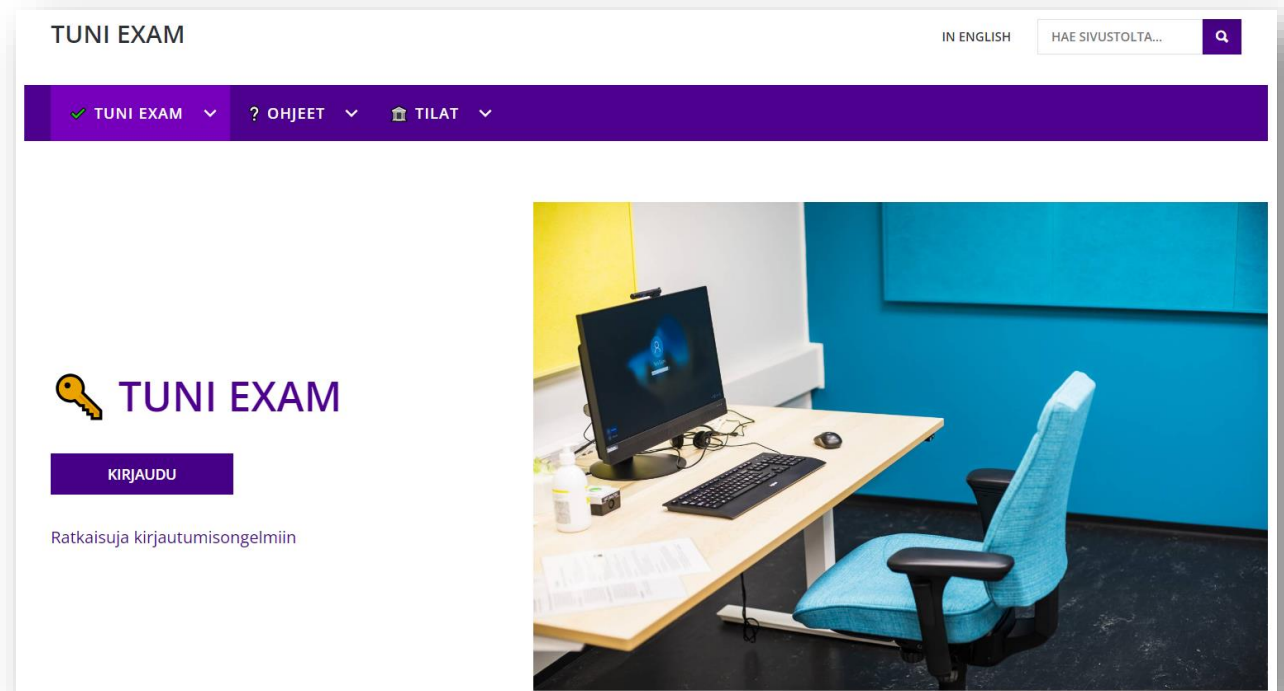

EXAM facilities

- EXAM facilities have camera surveillance (image and sound)
- The student enters the room with a personal access card and has to follow the Code of Contact in the EXAM facilities during the exam
- EXAM computers are Windows 10 computers with a limited software selection and no internet access.
- Certain EXAM rooms also feature additional equipment:
 - Headsets
 - Touch screen
 - Wacom drawing screen
 - Height-adjustable table
 - NVDA screen reading program



Possibilities in the TUNI EXAM system

- Flexibility in examination (e.g. visit exams)
- Diverse question types: Essay, multiple-choice, statement, and fill-in-the-blank
- Teacher collaboration: Question bank, shared exams and questions, and joint exams between two or more universities
- Extensive software selection and use of attachments during the exam
- Optional subjects (e.g. optional books or themes)
- Randomisation of questions
- Automatic assessment
- Accessibility (e.g. personal exam, accessible exam room)
- Coming Soon: BYOD exams

EXAM visit

- An EXAM visit means that a student can take an exam for a course from their own university in the EXAM room of another university.
- It enables flexible progression of studies even when the student is visiting or working in another town.
- It is the student's responsibility to carefully read the instructions of the target university and check, for example, the opening hours of exam rooms and the programs available on the target university's exam computer.
- The EXAM exam visit service is offered by about 20 Finnish universities.



EXAM consortium

- The national EXAM consortium, which includes 28 Finnish higher education institutions, is responsible for the maintenance and development of the system.
- Each higher education institution has a representative in both the consortium's management group and the developer group.
- The service provider of the system is CSC - Tieteen tietotekniikan keskus oy
